Dear Mr. Noble:

I am writing to seek an advisory opinion from the Federal Election Commission regarding the propriety of building a storage facility for my campaign records and materials.

I would like to build a medium-sized storage shed to store my campaign records and assorted campaign materials. I am planning to build this shed on my personal property and pay for it with my personal funds. I would then charge the campaign rent for the use of the facility. The rent would be equivalent to that charged by temporary storage facilities in the same area. The shed is intended for campaign materials while the campaign is paying rent, and the campaign will cease paying rent when the shed is no longer being used for campaign purposes.

This proposal seems clearly permitted under the Federal Election Campaign Act. I would appreciate receiving, at your earliest convenience, an advisory opinion as to whether this would be allowable under the Act and Commission regulations.
