Thank you for your prompt consideration.



Dear Mr. Litchfield:

I am writing to clarify the points specified in our phone conversation today.

- 1) The e-mail system which would be used for the PAC newsletter is the corporate e-mail system which is used for all electronic communication company-wide.
- 2) Many of our executive have computers but do not use them and instruct anyone wanting to send them e-mail to send it to their secretary. We also have many executives who do not have computers who can only be reached by e-mail through their secretary.
- The secretary would receive the original document not a copy of a document that was emailed to the executive.
- 4) The executive in question have all e-mail communication sent to their secretary.
