Dear Mr. Holtzman:

I am writing about the advisory opinion request that you submitted on behalf of Tally Up, LLC. Additional information has been requested on the proposal described in Tally Up's AOR. Specifically:

- 1. Where does Tally Up get the names of voters from which it creates voter segments?
- 2. In calculating the Voter Segment Score, does Tally Up aggregate all contributions made by individuals in the segment (and other similar voters) regardless of recipient or only contributions to specific categories of committees, e.g. Democratic candidate committees or party committees of the Republican Party?
- 3. On page 2 of the request, the second full paragraph, please clarify what "if any two voter segments have a difference of less than 100 voters, they will receive the same score regardless of when the reports are generated" means. For example, in the sample chart provided with the request, both Segment A and Segment B have the same number of voters (100), yet they have different scores. Does the sentence refer to requesting data on two segments with substantially overlapping voters, e.g. Democrats 25-35 in zip code 12345 and Democrats 25-30 in zip code 12345?
